PT Angkasa Pura (AP) II Airport requires aircraft passengers to use the PeduliLindungi application to process flight departures starting August 1st 2021

PT Angkasa Pura (AP) II Airport starting August 1st, 2021 requires prospective aircraft passengers to use the *PeduliLindungi* application to process flight departures. This is to support the implementation of the Circular Letter of the Minister of Health Number 847 Year 2021 concerning the Digitization of Health Documents for Air Transport Users which are Integrated with the *PeduliLindungi* application.

The utilization of the *PeduliLindungi* application to process departures has been implemented since July 2021 at AP II airport in the context of familiarization. During the familiarization period, the number of *PeduliLindungi* application users to process departures at AP II airport reached around 8,000 airplane passengers.

The President Director of AP II, Muhammad Awaluddin stated that after the familiarization period, the company's airports are now ready to fully implement CL Number 847 Year 2021. "*PeduliLindungi* ensures that the process of validating aircraft passenger health documents at the airport is carried out digitally so that it is safer, faster, easier, and strongly supports health protocols in the midst of the Covid-19 pandemic," as stated by Muhammad Awaluddin. Furthermore, Muhammad Awaluddin said *PeduliLindungi* application would be an important application for prospective airplane passengers in the midst of this pandemic condition. "At AP II airport, the *PeduliLindung* application will function as Terminal Access Control, Check-in Counter Access Control, and Health Validation Process Control. Following this, prospective passengers at AP II airport must use the *PeduliLindungi* application to process departures, " as he explained.

The benefits for prospective airplane passengers by using *PeduliLindungi* application are that the departure process can be made much simpler, minimizes physical contact, and becomes easier because they do not have to carry paper documents for the COVID-19 test results or vaccination cards. Prospective flight passengers simply show the QR Code in the *PeduliLindungi* application at the check-in counter. After that, there will be a notification to the check-in officer, whether the prospective passenger has met the health document requirements or not.

Covid-19 test results and vaccination cards are automatically uploaded to PeduliLindungi

As informed through the Minister of Health Decree Number 847 Year 2021 it is stated that laboratories and health facilities that perform RDT Antigen and PCR are required to enter test result data into the all record-tc-19 (New-all Record/NAR) applications. The test results will then appear in the *PeduliLindung* account of each prospective airplane passenger. Based on the Decree of the Minister of Health Number 4642 Year 2021, there are already 742 laboratories integrated with NAR. Then, to ensure that laboratory service standards are integrated with NAR, the Ministry of Health's Balitbang issued CL Number 4491 Year 2021 which states that reporting of test results for flights by laboratories/health facilities to all record-tc-19 (NAR) is carried out no later than 2 hours after the diversification examination results. "We urge prospective airplane passengers to carry out a Covid-19 test at one of the 742 laboratories that have been integrated with NAR, so that the test results are directly uploaded to *PeduliLindungi*," as stated by Muhammad Awaluddin.

Every prospective flight passenger who has been vaccinated against Covid-19 will automatically receive a digital vaccination card in the *PeduliLindungi* account. Following the obligation to use *PeduliLindung* application, AP II airport created a checkpoint that provides a QR Code Reader to scan the QR Code *PeduliLindungi* application for prospective passengers. If after scanning the *PeduliLindungi* account can be used to process departures, the prospective passenger will continue the process to the check-in counter. If not, the prospective flight passengers must validate the health documents at the related Ministry of Health's desk at the terminal. Prospective flight passengers can also check independently through the website <u>here</u> to see the status or completeness of their digital health documents.

AP II currently manages 20 airports, namely Soekarno-Hatta (Tangerang), Halim Perdanakusuma (Jakarta), Kualanamu (Medan), Supadio (Pontianak), Minangkabau (Padang), Sultan Mahmud Badaruddin II (Palembang), Sultan Syarif Kasim II (Pekanbaru), Husein Sastranegara (Bandung), Sultan Iskandar Muda (Banda Aceh), Raja Haji Fisabilillah (Tanjungpinang), Sultan Thaha (Jambi), Depati Amir (Pangkal Pinang), Silangit (North Tapanuli), Kertajati (Majalengka), Banyuwangi (Banyuwangi), Tjilik Riwut (Palangkaraya), Radin Inten II (Lampung), HAS Hanandjoeddin (Tanjung Pandan), Fatmawati Soekarno (Bengkulu), and General Soedirman (Purbalingga).
