Circular Letter No. 9 Year 2022 about Overseas Travel Health Protocol in the Times of Covid-19 Pandemic

On 2nd March 2022, the COVID-19 Response Acceleration Task Force has issued the Circular Letter No. 9 Year 2022 about Overseas Travel Health Protocol in the Times Corona Virus Disease Pandemic 2019 (Covid-19). The circular letter aims to implement health protocols against overseas travelers during the pandemic and to prevent an increase in the transmission of Covid-19. This is regulation is effective from 2 March 2022 until a later specified time.

There are several points highlighted in this regulation:

- 1. Overseas Travelers (PPLN) can enters the territory of Indonesia through the entry point overseas travel as follows:
 - a. Airport:
 - Soekarno Hatta, Banten;
 - Juanda, East Java;
 - Ngurah Rai, Bali;
 - · Hang Nadim, Riau Islands;
 - Raja Haji Fisabilillah, Riau Islands;
 - Sam Ratulangi, North Sulawesi; and
 - Zainuddin Abdul Madjid, West Nusa Tenggara.
 - b. Seaports:
 - Tanjung Benoa, Bali;
 - Batam, Riau Islands;
 - Tanjung Pinang, Riau Islands;
 - Bintan, Riau Islands; and
 - Nunukan, North Kalimantan.
 - c. Cross Border Posts:
 - Aruk, West Kalimantan;
 - Entikong, West Kalimantan; and
 - Motaain, East Nusa Tenggara.
- 2. Overseas Travelers for foreigners can enter the territory of Indonesia with the following criteria:
 - In accordance with the provisions of the Regulation of the Minister of Law and Human Rights Humans regarding the Granting of Immigration Visas and Residence Permits During the Handling of the Spread of Corona Virus Disease 2019 and National Economic Recovery
 - According to the agreement scheme (bilateral), such as the Travel Corridor Arrangements (TCA) between the Indonesian Government and the United Arab Emirates, China, South Korea, and Singapore
 - Get special consideration/permission in writing from Ministries/Institutions
- 3. Overseas Travelers (WNA and WNI) show negative results via RT-PCR test in country/region origin whose samples are taken within a maximum period of 2 x 24 hours before departure time and attached during the health checks or Indonesian International e-HAC.
- 4. Upon arrival, RT-PCR retest for PPLN and required to undergo centralized quarantine with the following provisions:
 - Quarantine for 7 x 24 hours for PPLN who have received the 1 (first) dose of vaccine;
 - Quarantine for 3 x 24 hours for PPLN who have received 2 (second) or 3 (third) dose of vaccine or;
 - For foreign travelers under 18 (eighteen) years old requires special protection, then the duration of quarantine follows the provisions imposed on people parents or caregiver/travel companion
- 5. PPLN need to do a second RT-PCR test which carried out with the following conditions:
 - In the morning of the 6th day of quarantine for quarantine with a duration of 7 x 24 hours.
 - In the morning of the 3th day of quarantine for quarantine with a duration of 3 x 24 hours.
- 6. If the result is *negative*, the overseas travelers are allowed to continue travel and are advised to self-quarantine for 14 days and implement health protocols.
- 7. If the result is *positive*, overseas travelers are not allowed to continue travel should follow up with the following conditions;
 - if asymptomatic or experiencing mild symptoms, isolated or treated in isolation hotels or facilities centralized isolation established by the government; or
 - if accompanied by moderate or severe symptoms, and/or uncontrolled co morbidities, isolation or treatment at a Covid-19 referral hospital; and
 - Isolation/treatment costs for PPLN WNA are charged on a basis independent, while for WNI is borne by the government.

With the enactment of this Circular Letter, therefore, the Circular Letter No. 7 Year 2022 about the Overseas Travel Health Protocols in the Future the Corona Virus Disease 2019 (Covid-19) pandemic is **revoked and declared invalid.**
