Circular Letter of the COVID -19 Response Acceleration Task Force No. 22 Year 2021 Concerning Conditions of Domestic Travel during the Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19) Pandemic

In accordance with the Circular Letter of the COVID-19 Response Acceleration Task Force No. 22 Year 2021 concerning Provisions for Domestic Travel during the Corona Virus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) Pandemic, the rules for domestic travel with various modes of transportation, ranging from land, sea, train, to plane, have been re-updated. The provisions are effective from Tuesday, November 2nd, 2021.

Referring to Circular Letter of the COVID-19 Response Acceleration Task Force No. 22 Year 2021, travelers by sea, land transportation (using private or public vehicles), crossings and inter-city trains must meet the following conditions:

- 1. It is mandatory to use the PeduliLindungi application
- 2. Attach a vaccine card (at least the first dose)
- 3. Negative results of RT-PCR 3x24 hours or negative results of rapid antigen 1x24 hours before departure.
- 4. For routine trips by land transportation modes using private or public vehicles, and trains in 1 urban agglomeration area are excluded from the above conditions.

While the provisions for long-distance travel by plane are as follows:

- 1. Travelers from and to areas in Java and Bali and between cities within Java and Bali are required to show:
- It is mandatory to use the PeduliLindungi application
- Attach a vaccine card (at least the first dose)
- Negative result of RT-PCR 3x24 hours (for those who have just vaccinated the first dose)
- Negative result of rapid antigen 1x24 hours before departure (for those who have been fully vaccinated with two doses)
- 2. For inter-district or inter-city travel outside Java-Bali, travelers are required to show:
- It is mandatory to use the PeduliLindung application
- Attach a vaccine card (at least the first dose)
- Negative results of RT-PCR 3x24 hours or negative results of rapid antigen 1x24 hours before departure

As in the latest regulations, the obligation to show a vaccine card is excluded for:

- 1. Travelers under 12 years old
- 2. Logistics vehicles and other goods transportation operators who travel outside Java and Bali
- 3. Travelers with special health conditions or comorbid illnesses that cannot receive the vaccine. Instead, it is mandatory to attach a doctor's certificate from the Government Hospital stating that the person concerned has not and/or is unable to take part in the COVID-19 vaccination.
