



The Central Bureau of Statistics (Badan Pusat Statistik/BPS) Indonesia released a publication with the title of “*Indonesian Statistics in Infographics 2023*”, which aims to provide visualized data that includes developments in socio-demographic and economic conditions in Indonesia from 2021 to 2022.

There are several aspects highlighted in this publication with the details as follows:

1. **Mining and Energy**

The mining and energy were categorized into:

a. **Coal**

It is reported that the Indonesia's coal production surged to an impressive 614 million tons in 2021. 56% of the coal production was destined for export, with a total of 345 million tons or equivalent to USD 26 billion. The coal and lignite mining industry proved to be an economic powerhouse, contributing nearly 4% to Indonesia's total Gross Domestic Product (GDP), with a total of IDR 603 trillion. Furthermore, the domestic consumption of coal was notable accounting for 112 million tons, with 18% of production being used to fuel domestic power companies.

b. **Electricity**

Indonesia's total electricity generation consist of 289,474.49 GWh in 2021, with 89% of this energy being distributed across the Indonesian archipelago. It is also emphasized that 97% of households had adopted State Electricity Company (Perusahaan Listrik Negara/PLN) electricity as their primary source of illumination, underscoring the widespread reach of the electricity supply infrastructure.

2. **Manufacturing Industrial**

Indonesia's manufacturing industries showed a different aspect of Indonesia's economic landscape. Between 2020 and 2021, there was a noteworthy increase of 1.313 Large and Medium establishments, while Micro establishments experienced a substantial surge, adding 46.365 enterprises.

3. **Construction**

The Construction Sector in Indonesia demonstrated robust performance, boasting a substantial number of 203,403 incorporated construction establishments, employing 1.150.670 individuals as permanent and contract workers.

In terms of value, construction works completed in 2021 accounted for impressive IDR 1.415.568,206 million, with DKI Jakarta Province leading the charge by contributing IDR 573.691.379 million to this figure.
